

Our annual 4th & 5th grade 4-H Pumpkin project is now upon us! The pumpkin creation must stay within a 13"x13" area, as exceeding this space will disqualification. For safety preservation, no pushpins, punctures, or carvings are not allowed. Tacky Glue or hot glue is recommended. Additionally, your child is required to write at least two paragraphs of a fictional or nonfictional story that is connected to their pumpkin creation. Judges will evaluate the entries based on how well they embody the theme, fit the age group, and the quality of the grammar and story line. This project is a reflection of their 4-H work! We encourage participants to consider donating their creations to a nursing home, hospital, shelter, or other local business as part of the 4-H community service mission."
