Is Your Bull Ready to Go?

An open cow can be a bad blow to the pocketbook of a small herd, but if that is so, a bull that is found to be sterile is a disaster! So is your bull ready for spring turnout?

You don't have to guess or hope for the best. On Saturday, March 29 at the Bill Hayter farm in Washington County. Dr. Tom VanDyke will be on site to test your bull to be sure he is ready to service your cows.

While the BSE (Breeding Soundness Exam) testing is not free, bringing the bulls to the event saves you a farm call charge and helps streamline the process. There is a limit of two bulls per farm. If you have more bulls than that, you likely need to schedule an on-farm BSE program.

Testing will be done by appointment only so bulls won't be standing around, getting upset, and getting in trouble. To schedule your bull(s) and get directions to the farm call Phil Blevins' office at 276 676-6309.
